1.1 Background

Standing orders on Disasters (SOD) has clearly been stipulated to take initiative for formulating Disaster Management Action Plan at District, Upazila , Pourashava and City Corporation level incorporating Disaster Risk Reduction and contingency plan. Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief have taken this with serious focusing. The Disaster Management Plan will be developed for a period of 5 years.

Bangladesh is one of the most disaster prone countries in the world. In each and every year more or less all districts experiences different kinds of disasters. Among most vulnerable districts Chittagong is among them. Due to geographical location and impact of Climatic Change, almost every year this district has been affected by different natural disasters like Flood, excessive rain, Cyclone, tornado, tidal surge, intrusion of Salinity, Arsenicosis etc. As the district is most close to sea, there is huge risks for disasters like Cyclone, tidal surging, flood and all these in some way or other affect and damage this coastal areas.

Among all upazilas of Chittagong, Rangunia upazila is more risky and vulnerable to disasters. There are fifteen (15) Unions and one Pourashava under this Upazila. Each and every year one union or other has been severely affected by different natural disasters like flesh food, tornado, salinity, water stagnation, drought etc.

1.2 Objectives of DM Planning

- Prepare a strategic document for certain areas and time
- It will act as a Comprehensive Plan for relevant all sectors including local and national level Disaster Management Committees.
- This Plan will provide guidance in formulating and implementing plan for all partners relevant to Disaster Management.
- Create effective partnership sense and participation in Disaster Planning of local communities and make development of risk reduction system by using local resources.
- Exercise and use locally developed planning for Need Assessment, Rescue, relief and rapid rehabilitation.
- Create awareness on disaster risks and to develop pragmatic means at union, upazila and district level for disaster risk reduction.

1.3 Introduction to local areas:

Rangunia upazila is an important habitant of Chittagong district. It is located in the North East of Chittagong district. The Chittagong to Kaptai road has crossed this Upazila. A large eastern part of the Upazila is covered by hills and dense forest. Two mighty rivers Isamoti and Karnafulli have crossed this Upazila. This upazila is bordered with hilly district Rangamati that is a district of 3 Chittagong Hill district.

1.3.1. Geographical locations of Rangunia Upazila.

Kaukhali is in the north of Rangunia Upazila and in the south it is Chandanaish upazila and Bandarban Sadar, in the east it is Kaptai and Rashthali upazila of Rangamati district. In the west it is Raoujan and Boalkhali Upazila. This Upazila is about 40 KM away from Chittagong city. Its areas are 347.73 Sq.KM. The upaila is consists of 156 villages, 72 mouzas, 15 unions, and 1 Pourashava. There are 1072 KM road in this Upazila. Among them 574 KM are Kacha , 329 KM Semi Pucca and 169 KM paved. There is one embankment which is about 24.25 KM Long.

1.3.2 Areas

The Chittagong district was formally created in 1966 and its areas are 5282.98 Sq. KM. There are 14 Upazilas under Chittgaong district and Rangunia is one of them. Its areas are 347.73 Sq. KM. There are 15 unions, 1 Pourashava, 72 Mouzas and 165 villages. Union base list of Mouzas are provided below-

1.4 Infrastructure and brief detail of infrastructures

4.1 Infrastructures:

Ka) Embankment-

There are embankments on rivers and canals to protect intrusion of flood and tidal water to Rangunia upazila. Total length of embankments are 24.25 KM. Number of embankments and its locations are exhibited below-

- There is a .50 KM embankment from Isamoti 2 no ward to Isamoti government Primary school. Height of this embankment are 15 feet. Again there are another .50 KM embankment from farampara to Maizepara and its height are 15 feet.
- There is a 6 KM embankment from Purba Sabdinagar to Uttar parua and its height are 12 feet.
- There is a 3 KM embankment from Pachim betagi to Mohamuni in the 1,2 and 3 no wards and its height are 12 feet.
- There are a 5 KM embankment from Lalanagar Chandnagar to Garakhil mogul Isamoti khal in the 1,2,3 and 7 no wards and its height are 12 feet.
- There is a .25 KM embankment in the 1 no ward of Hosnabad union and its height are 12 feet.
- There is a 5 KM embankment in the 5,6,7 and 8 no ward of Shilok union and its height are 12 feet.
- There is a 5 KM embankment in the 3,4,5 and 6 no ward of Padua union and its height are 12 feet.

Kha) Sluice gate

There are 15 sluice gates at 15 unions of Rangunia Upazila.

- Moriumnagar union: There is only 1 sluice gate. It is located at Khatakhali khal of 8 no ward.
- Joara union: There is only 1 sluice gate. It is located on the Mukti Stream at ward no 1.
- Parua union: There is only 1 sluice gate and it is located on the Latichara canal at ward no 3.
- Batagi union: There is only 1 sluice gate and it is located on the Katakhal canal at ward no 1.
- Sarafbhata union: There is only 1 sluice gate and it is located on the Cheringa canal at ward no 7.
- Chandragona union: There are 2 sluice gate one is on the Mahafuz canals of ward no 2 and 3 and another one is on the Khatakhali canals in the ward no 1.
- Sawanirbar union: There is only 1 sluice gate and it is on the Boalmara canal of 4 no ward.

- Hosnabad union: There are 2 sluice gate in this union. 1 is on the Gadra canals of ward no 1 and another 1 is on the Kurmai canal in the ward no 5.
- Padua union: There are 3 Sluice gates in this union.
- Shilok union: There are 2 Sluice gates in this union.

Ga) Bridges:

There are 77 bridges in 15 unions of Rangunia Upazila. Union wise list of bridges and their locations exhibited below-

- **Moriumnagar union:** Total numbers of bridges in this union are 19. 2 are on the College gate road at 1 no ward, another 1 is on the DC road. 2 are on the Rashidiapara gramma road at 2 no ward and another 1 is on the Aziz canal. 1 is on the Pagla mama Road at 3 no ward, another is on Amirpara road, and another one is on Tea garden road at 4 no ward another one is on the Marampara road. of 1 no ward, another one is on the Bhagban Chowdhury hat of 6 no ward, another one is on Masjidda Madrasha road and another one is on the Baitali dewanhat road at ward no 8. It may be mentioned here that all bridges are in good condition and usable and bridges on road are useful for water disposal.
- **Pomra Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 4. 1 is bridge is Bipula Khal at 4 no ward, another bridge is Kaokhali bridge at 7 no ward, another bridge is Hagipara road at 9 no ward.
- **Lalanagar Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 12. Those Bridge are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Betagi Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 15. Those Bridge are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Sarafbhata Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 3. 1 is bridge is Karnafully River at 4 no ward, another bridge is Prakallpo road at 9 no ward, another bridge is Hagipara road at 9 no ward.
- **Hosnabad Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 5. 1 is bridge is Kurmai Khal at 3 no ward, another bridge is Pakuya Khal at 5 no ward, another 2 bridge are Srimai Khal road at 7 & 9 noo wards.
- **Kodala Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 6. 1 is bridge is Noa Khal at 2 no ward, another bridge is Nalichari Khal at 5 no ward, another 2 bridge are Srimai Khal road at 7 & 9 noo wards.
- **Rajanagar Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 1. 1 is bridge is Bagra Khal at 3 no ward.
- **Parua Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 1. 1 is bridge is Echamati Khal at 8 no ward.
- **Sanirbhar Rangunia Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 2. 1 is bridge is Changmai Khal at 7 no ward & another bridge is Changmai Khal at 8 no ward.

- **Shilok Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 2. 1 is bridge is Shilok Khal at 5 no ward & another bridge is Shilok Khal at 7 no ward.
- **Padua Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 1. 1 bridge is on the Padua Khal at 8 no ward.
- **South Rajanagar Union:** Total no of Bridge in this union are 1. This bridge is on the Shilok & Padua Khal at 8 no ward.

GHa) Culverts:

There are 370 culverts of 14 unions of Rangunia Upazila. These culverts support in discharging of water of Hilly Charra, Sub-rivers, branch rivers and rivers. Number of Culverts and locations of culverts are provided below-

- **Mariumnagar Union:** Total no of Culverts are 42. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Pomra Union:** Total no of Culverts are 35. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Lalanagar Union:** Total no of Culverts are 23. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Betagi Union:** Total no of Culverts are 49. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Sarafbhata Union:** Total no of Culverts are 42. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Hosnabad Union:** Total no of Culverts are 16. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Kodala Union:** Total no of Culverts are 13. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Shilok Union:** Total no of Culverts are 9. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Shanirbhor Rangunia Union:** Total no of Culverts are 13. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Islampur Union:** Total no of Culverts are 15. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Soufth Rajanagar Union:** Total no of Culverts are 27. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Rajanagar Union:** Total no of Culverts are 24. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Padua Union:** Total no of Culverts are 31. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Chandraghona Union:** Total no of Culverts are 23. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.
- **Parua Union:** Total no of Culverts are 21. Those culverts are in from 1 to 9 no wards.

Uma) Roads:

There are total 1072 KM roads at 15 unions of Rangunia upazila of Chittagong. Among them 169 KM are paved, 574 KM Kacha and 329 KM HBB road. Number of roads and location statistics are appended below-

Betagi union: There are total 20 KM Pucca road, 42 KM Kacha and 24 KM HBB road. Among them 17 KM Kucha and 15 HBB road of 1, 2, 5, 8 & 9 wards are in bad shape.

Parua union: There are total 10 KM Pucca road, 40 KM Kacha and 4 KM HBB road. Among them 16 KM Kucha and 3 HBB roads of 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 & 9 wards are in bad shape.

Mariumnagar union: There are total 6 KM Pucca road, 16 KM Kacha and 17 KM HBB road. Among them 10 KM Kucha and 5 HBB road of 1, 2, 5, 8 & 9 wards are in bad shape.

Pomra union: There are total 14 KM Pucca road, 42 KM Kacha and 37 KM HBB road. Among them 42 KM Kucha and 15 KM HBB road of 2, 5, 8 & 9 no wards are in bad shape.

Lalanagar union: There are total 6 KM Pucca road, 20 KM Kacha and 15 KM HBB road. Among them 6 KM Kucha and 4 KM HBB road of 1, 2, 5, 8 & 9 no wards are in bad shape.

Sarafbhata union: There are total 4.5 KM Pucca road, 20 KM Kacha and 12 KM HBB road. Among them 7 KM Kucha and 4 KM HBB road of 1, 2, 5, & 9 no wards are in bad shape.

South Rajanagar union: There are total 18 KM Pucca road, 45 KM Kacha and 15 KM HBB road. Among them 17 KM Kucha and 15 KM HBB road of 1, 2, 5, 8 & 9 no wards are in bad shape.

Shanirbhar Rangunia union: There are total 2 KM Pucca road, 20 KM Kacha and 6 KM HBB road. Among them 5 KM Kucha and 3 HBB road of 1, 2, 5, 8 & 9 no wards are in bad shape.

Chandraghoan union: There are total 5 KM Pucca road, 18 KM Kacha and 10 KM HBB road. Among them 7 KM Kucha and 5 KM HBB road of 1, 2, 5, 8 & 9 no wards are in bad shape.

Hosnabad union: There are total 16 KM Pucca road, 28 KM Kacha and 25 KM HBB road. Among them 10 KM Kucha and 8 KM HBB road of 1, 2, 5, 8 & 9 no wards are in bad shape.

Islampur union: There are total 20 Km is Pucca road, 100 Km kacha and 50 KM HBB road. Among them 30 KM Kucha and 20 HBB road of 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 & 9 wards are in bad shape.

Kodala union: There are total 4.5 KM Pucca road, 50 KM Kacha and 40 KM HBB road. Among them 27 KM Kucha and 25 KM HBB road of 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 & 9 no wards are in bad shape.

Rajanagar union: There are total 5 Km is Pucca road, 95 Km kacha and 25 KM HBB road. Among them 17 KM Kucha and 15 HBB road of 1, 2, 5, 8 & 9 wards are in bad shape.

Shilok union: There are total 16 KM Pucca road, 28 KM Kacha and 25 KM HBB road. Among them 17 KM Kucha and 15 KM HBB road of 1, 2, 5, 8 & 9 no wards are in bad shape.

Padua union: There are total 21 KM Pucca road, 15 KM Kacha and 12 KM HBB road. Among them 17 KM Kucha and 15 KM HBB road of 1, 2, 5, 8 & 9 no wards are in bad shape.

Ca) Irrigation system:

Use of tube wells for crop production is not much in Rangunia Upazila. Most deep tube wells are used as sources of drinking water and used in homes and some are used for crop production. Total number of tube wells in 15 unions of Rangunia Upazila are 8271. Among them deep tube wells are 1700, Tube wells are 6151. Detail description are provided below-

1.4.2 Social Assets

(ka) House/homes-

There are 62225 houses in 15 unions of Rangunia upazila. Among them 22293 are Kacha, 17792 are Pucca and 22220 are semi pucca. Pucca houses are made of bricks, sand, cement and rod and kacha houses are made of Bamboo, trees, tin, Chan, wire and nails, rope, and bamboo fencing. Kacha houses are not disaster resilient. About 40% houses are below flood level. Union wise detail of houses are provided below-

(Ca) Health Service:

There are 43 health and family welfare centers at 15 unions of Rangunia Upazila. Among them 1 is Upazila Health Complex, Union level health and family welfare centers are 10, and union satellite clinics are 32. There are total 74 doctors serving in these centers. It may be mentioned here that there are other staff other than doctors in those health centers. But number of doctors and staff are not sufficient in those health centers particularly Satellite and community health clinics. So the quality of health services is not up to the mark. To take special care for aged and pregnant women during disaster is very crucial during disasters but this hamper due to lack of sufficient doctors and nurses. So sufficient doctors, nurses and medicines should be make available.

(Tha) Communication & means of transport:

There are land and river communication from Rangunia Upazila to district and vice versa. The most easiest and notable mode of transport by road is bus, truck, lorry, cargo, rickshaw van, Train etc. Buses play in 8 unions out of total 15 unions. In addition, CNG, Van, Auto rickshaw and Vatvati in these areas.

(Da) Forest & Afforestation: There are 37390 acres forests at Rangunia Upazila in Chittagong District. Expansion of forest areas is seen in this Upazila. But now few forest sites are on the verge of extinction due to human induced causes and natural adversities. Apart from hilly forest, social forestation has been done on both sides of road and embankments. Trees that are found in those areas are Akash, Gadan, Moni, Sagun, Chambal, raintree, Korai, epil, epil, Guzan, gamari, neem, jam, mangoes, jackfruits, amda, Lime, guava, Pineapples, Bamboos, Rubber etc. Besides few trees are found in homesteads level.

1.4.3 Weather & Climate:

Ka) Raining trend- Analyzing the average rainfall at Rangunia upazila, it is found that average rainfall in this upazila is almost same. During last 1995 to 2013 the average rainfall was 3,6,7 & 8 respectively. But it needed more research to ascertain that this trend is the outcome of climatic change. Due to the change of rainfall pattern, the period of rainfall is getting delayed and as a result cropping pattern is also changing. As a result, production cost is increasing and amount of production is decreasing day by day. Diseases and attack of insects are also increasing. Erratic and untimely rain is affecting crop and cultivation and livelihoods.

Kha) Temperature: Heat wave has been found due to indiscriminate cutting of trees and hilly locations. Now the Rangunia upazila experiences highest 39.5 degree Celsius and lowest 12.5 degree Celsius. During raining monsoon the average temperature remains 22.5 degree Celsius. In most cases, the temperature remains normal but it is known from local people that the temperature is rising day by day. Especially the temperature has raised during last 10-15 years that normal life of people becoming harder. The main reason of heat wave is rise of humidity in air. Cultivation has been hampering due to increase of heat. The affect will be more significant if the present trend continues. According to Public Health Engineering (PHE) survey is conducted two times in each year and the finding is that water level comes down during the month of April and May that results decrease of safe drinking water. This will be a great barrier for future development.

Ga) Underground layer- According to information of Public Health Engineering (DPHE) a survey is conducted in each year to assess the underground layer of water. It is found that it was 275-280 feet in 2003 for deep tube wells, 40-42 feet for shallow tube wells. In 2004 it was 270-280 feet for deep tube wells, and 30-32 feet for shallow tube wells. In 2005, it was 270-280 feet for deep tube wells, 63-66 feet for shallow tube wells. In 2006, it was 375-379 feet for deep tube wells, 35-38 feet for shallow tube wells. In 2007, it was 455-458 feet for deep tube wells and 70-72 feet for shallow tube wells. In 2008, it was 445-450 feet for deep tube wells and 70-71 feet for shallow tube wells. In 2009, it was 447-450 feet for deep tube wells and 65-68 feet for shallow tube wells. In 2010, it was 472-475 feet for deep tube wells and 70-72 feet for shallow tube wells. In 2012, it was 447-450 feet for deep tube wells and 63-66 feet for shallow tube wells. Underground water level gets down more in the month of May. According to community people – water has becoming scarce day by day due to downing of water level and intrusion of saline water is destroying the water balance of upper level. Locals opinions is that safe water level are getting down and it is great barrier for sustainable development.

Cauliflower, Cabbage, Kakrol, Barbati, Sweet gourd, brinjal, Panni kumra, ladies finger, Mullah, Chili, carrot, tomatoes, Cucumber, Puishak, Lalshak and kachushak etc are abundantly produced in this Upazila. Principal foods of this Upazila are rice, fish, pulse; bread and main food habit are 1 time in the early, 1 time in the noon, and 1 time in the night. Union wise crop production are appended below-

Islampur Union: About 3500 acres land are damaged by different disasters including flood, excessive rain, Tornados, River Erosion, Land Slide etc.

South Rajanagar Union: About 8000 acres land are damaged by different disasters including flood, excessive rain, Tornados, River Erosion, Land Slide etc

Lalanagar Union: About 1425 acres land are damaged by different disasters including flood, excessive rain, Tornados, River Erosion, Land Slide etc

(Ga) Rivers: Karnafully river has crossed Rangunia Upazila. Its length are 26 KM. Benefit is that fish are abundant in these rivers and many people live on this including fishermen. During dry monsoon, when water becomes scarce, people cultivate their land by using this river water. The fertility of land increases with the siltation of new soil or fertile soil and it increases crop production. Apart from these, people of this Upazila get benefit in many other ways.

2nd Chapter: Disasters, Hazard and vulnerability

2.1 History of Disaster:

Rangunia Upazila is most vulnerable upazila among all upazilas of Chittagong district. Every year this upazila experiences one disaster or other. Each year huge resources are damaged and normal human lives are shattered due to different disasters like hilly flood, flood, river erosion, tornadoes, cyclone, drought and water loggings. Strong cyclone, tornado, tidal surge etc flowed during 1991 and 2007. All unions were affected by these disasters including Pourashava. 15 unions were damaged extensively. The speed of wind was 220-243 KM / hour. Many people died and it caused huge damaged on agriculture, fisheries, livestock, sanitation and infrastructures. Many government, non-government and foreign development organizations came forward to help the distress people. Apart from this, they provided support on recovery, rescue, primary treatment and distribution of medicines, distribution of dry foods, rehabilitation and other support.

2.3 Different hazards, it's present & future –

- 1. Onrush of hilly water** -There are hills in some unions though the upazila are not known as Hilly upazila. Homes are destroyed due to onrush of hilly water, crop land are damaged, trees are affected, roads becomes temporarily snapped. It may be mentioned here that people living in hills are killed by excessive rain due to lack of awareness. So there is risk that people may die in greater number if they are not removed from hills and appropriate rehabilitation work is not undertaken during excessive raining.
- 2. Flood:** Flood has been occurring in each and every year in Rangunia upazila. Crop land of about 14700 acres are inundated , and fishes of about 420 ponds are swept away , about 130 KM Kacha roads are damaged and houses of 5020 families are damaged by inundation and about 390 tubewells are affected. It may be mentioned here that intensity of flood is increasing due to losing of navigability of halda river and lack of low height of upazila protection embankment. The extent of damage will increase substantially if this trend continues.
- 3. Water Logging :** Water logging occurs as the upazila is closed to karnafully and Isamati rivers and as hilly water onrush occurs in this upazila during rainy season. Many diseases are spreaded due to water logging and about 1250 acres crop land are affected. So it is much important to take necessary actions to get over this situation in future.
- 4. Tornado:** Tornado hits this upazila every year as the upazila is closed to karnafully and Isamati rivers and impact of climatic change. About 11050 acres crop are partly damaged, 2100 Kacha homes are damaged, trees are broken or uprooted and damage to infrastrcutures are occured. The extent of damage can be much more if tornado resilient homes are not made and plan is not undertaken to prevent it.

5. River erosion: River erosion is seen in few unions as mighty Karnafully and Isamati flows through this upazila. About 2000-2500 acres crop land are affected by river erosion. Besides, 300 homes are damaged, and few fish farms are affected. It may be mentioned here that future risks can be minimized if banks of Halda river are covered with concrete blocks.

6. Snow rain: Snow rain is occurs in Rangunia upazila in every year. This hazard more or less affect almost all unions. As a result, 200-250 acres crops are affected. The risks can be minimized if cultivation of disaster resilient crop is done in future.

2.4 Vulnerability and Capacity:

(Ka) Vulnerability means socio, economic and environmental condition that indicates disasters and people do not have capacity to face them.

(Kha) Capacity means natural, social and environmental induced condition or process by which people or organizations face adverse situation and reduces the havoc of disasters.

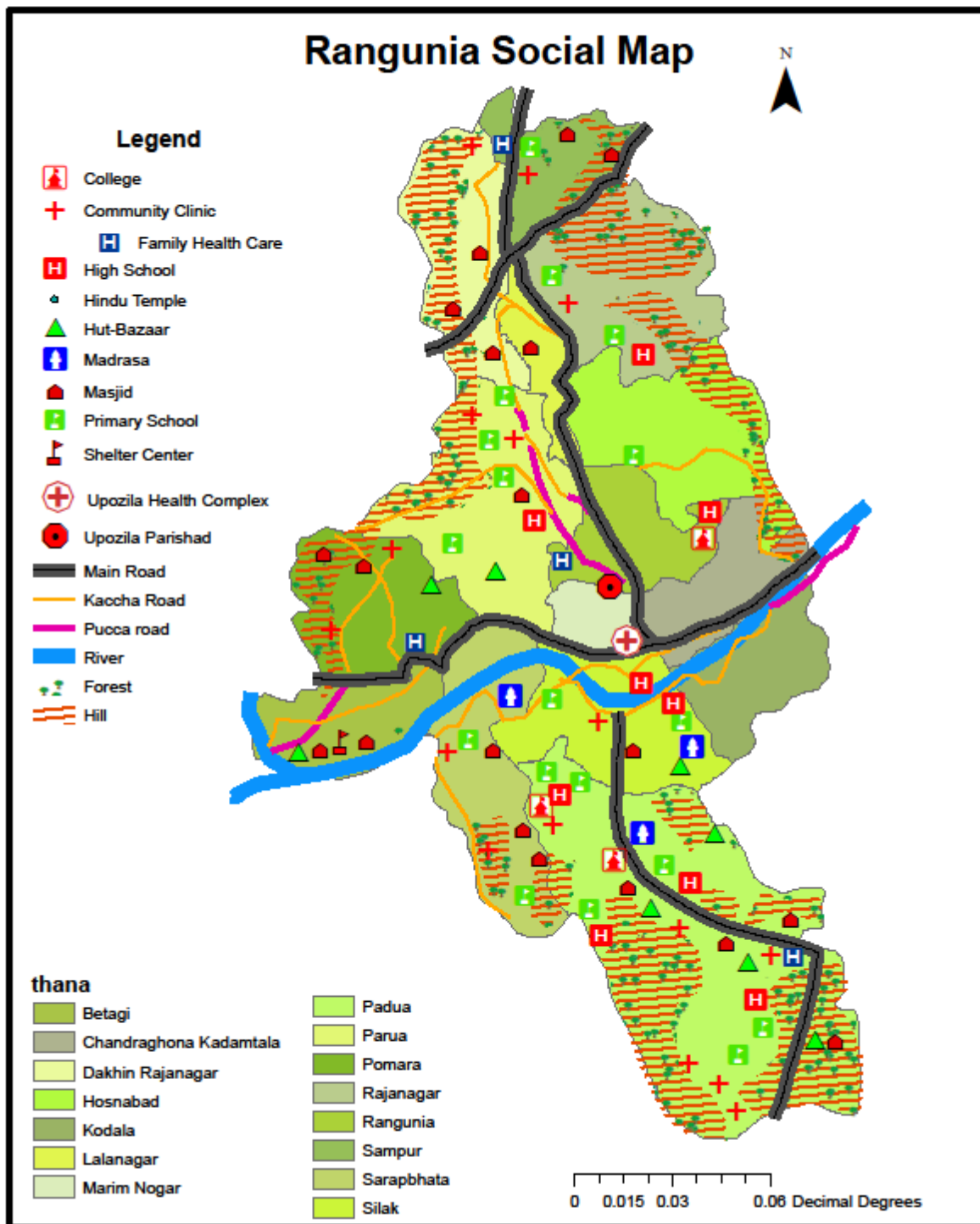

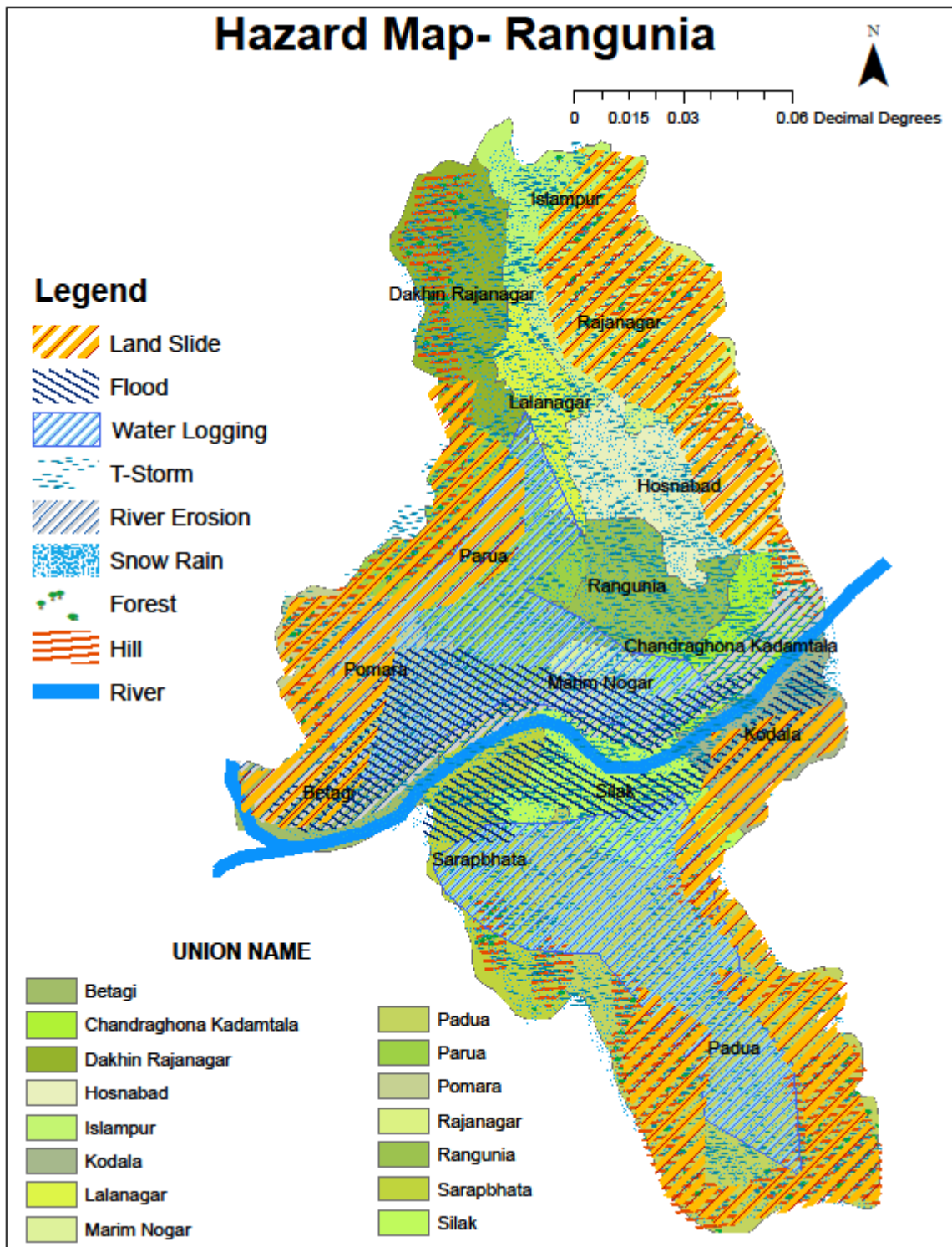

Calendar Analysis:

Rangunia upazila is a disaster prone area. It is know from interaction with community people that hazards like hilly water on rush, flood, river erosion, tornado, drought, cold wave and attack of elephants are occurred in almost 15 unions of this Upazila. Occurrence time of hazards has been shown in above charts. Detail is being analysis below-

- 1. On rush of hilly water:** During interaction with local people it is know that hills are abundances in most parts of the Upazila. On rush of hilly ware occurs every year during rainy monsoon in these areas and it damages local resources. On rush of hilly water is the most devastating hazards than other hazards. Usually this on rush occurs during Azar to Asin month.
- 2. Flood:** It is known that unions are close to rivers and canals and flood occurs every year due to climatic change. Flood occurs from Asar to Asin month

- 4. Tornado:** It is known from interacting with local people that Tornado is another hazard that occurs almost every year. It took huge tool to lives and other resources. Usually this is happen from Baishak to Justa month.

5. **River Erosion:** It is known that river erosion is a major hazard in this Upazila. Every year homes and crop land are devoured by this erosion. This is happened from Asar to Ashin month.
6. **Snow rain:** Snow rain is occurs in Rangunia upazila in every year. This hazard more or less affect almost all unions. As a result, 200-250 acres crops are affected. The risks can be minimized if cultivation of disaster resilient crop is done in future

4.1.1 Operation of Emergency Control room:

A control room is organized at the office of Upazial Nirbahi Officer during disasters. There is a register. Who, when will deliver their responsibilities is written in this register and what kind of message is received and what kind of message is sent to whom is written in this register. A union based LGED MAL is kept in the room and various locations, roads for communication, khals and embankments etc is written in this MAP.

2 members of Upazila Disaster Management Committee (UzDMC) work in this control room by turns after just after occurrence of disasters and a police also present in this center. Responsible 3 people deliver their duties by turns and a 3 member voluntary team work 24 hours by turns. Full time contact is maintained through phone or mobile with Unions and district.

Just after the disasters, affected areas are identified in this MAP. It may be mentioned here that control room lacks some instrument like large torch light, gumboot, life jacket and raincoat etc.

4.2.1 Keep volunteers ready:

- Organize groups with leadership of UP members at ward level.
- Circulate information and warning message through volunteers
- Organize training for members of volunteers on different responsibilities like signaling, messaging, rescue, disposal and shelter management and risk reduction.

4.2.2 Circulate warning message:

- Ward UP members will circulate the warning message to every homes of all wards as his own responsibilities.
- Circulation of 5 no danger warning shloud be done through Miking at least once in one hour.

4.2.3 Approach of removing community npeople

- Ward UP member will start removing people to shelters just after getting message of taking shelter to shelter centers through radio and TV.
- Miking should be started to take shelter of high risk people immediately after announcement of 8 no waring and volunteers will put pressure of taking sheler by moving house to house. They should be moved if necessary. People having risk must keep informed about their respective shelter.

4.2.4 Rescue & Primary Medical service:

- This responsibility should be entrusted to the members of District and Upazila Disaster Management Committee of high risk areas.
- A permanent fund should be created under the supervision of District and Upazial Disaster Management Committee for rescue operation.
- Conduct and establish temporary rescue camp.
- Send ill person, aged, children and delivering pregnant women urgently to hospitals.
- Up members with the help of volunteers will put dead animals into grave and dead men to burials.

4.2.5 Maintanence of Shelter centers:

- Keep cyclone centers ready after doing necessary repair before start of Disaster monsoon.
- Finalize the cyclone centers or safe centers during emergency.
- Ensure security of women, children, and disbled during disasters.
- Ensure safe drinking water and other services.

4.2.6 Keep ready boats:

- DDMC and UzDMC will update the list of engines driven boats and make a selection for use during disasters.
- Boats owners will provide assistance to them.

4.2.7 Need assessment of damages and send report:

- Send SOS for within 24 hours of disaster happening and 'D' form within 7 days to UP Chairman.
- UP Chairman will send compiled ward report to Chairmen of Upazila DMC within next 12 hours through UP secretary.

4.2.8 Coordinate of relief activities:

- UP Chairman will coordinate all relief activities of different relief agencies.
- Maintain a register about the relief materials arrived and inform control room about the operating areas and groups working in those areas.

4.2.9 Collect & keep ready dry foods and life saving medicines:

- Collect and procure dry foods like Chira, Muri from local hat/bazaars for prompt distribution.
- Collect rice, pulses, Atta, oil and house building materials like Tin,, Perek, and nylon ropes from local Bazaars.
- Prepare a list of necessary medicines with the help of Health assistant and Family Planning Assistant.

4.2.10 Treatment/ Vaccination of Domestic animals:

- Keep ready medicines at Union Parishad Bhaban or Health centers from upazila livestock office.
- Members of Union disaster Management Committee (UDMCs) should be imparted training on Animal treatment.
- Experienced men must be involved in Animal treatment activity during disasters.

4.2.11 Organize drill:

- Drills should be organized on warning, forecasting, removal, recovery, and management of primary relief operation.
- Disasters drills should be organized periodically in cyclone/ flood prone areas.
- Examine the strength of preparation through drills on April and May of each year with vulnerable communities.
- During drills focus should be given to move ill, disables, lactating mothers/ pregnant women and children towards shelters.
- Drills should be conducted in areas risky for disasters on how move people to shelters.

4.2.12 Conduction of emergency control room:

- Emergency control rooms must be organized at unions/upazila/district offices just after disaster occurrence. Presence of Gram police members and 3/4 volunteers must be ensured by turns in these centers.
- Secretary of union Parishad and responsible person will be in duties of EOCs. Each team should consist of at least 3 members and 3 volunteers will deliver duties at EOC by turns. UP secretary will supervise activities all the time.

4.2.13 Shelters / safe places -

- Places which are safe from inundation during floods and away from river erosion can be used as Shelters.

Selected shelters, local schools and colleges, government and non-government institutions, high road, and embankments can be used as shelters.

5.1 Assessment of damage:

Agriculture	The amount of total firm land is about 3070 acres Aman, Aus, Boro, and Robi crops and cultivation of Guava and vegetables can badly be affected if a flood similar to 1991 occurs or hits this upazila. About 1560 acres crop can be damaged each year by hilly water onrush. Partly damage of 1500 acres crop is occurred by tornados. About 1240 acres crop can be damaged by Flood. Soil fertility is decreasing day by day. About 1130 acres crop can be affected if a draught. About 1210 acres crop can be affected if a major water logging in this upazila.
Fisheries	Fishes of about 1442 ponds are flown away if a flood hits the Upazila. Fishes of about 210 ponds out of 1800 ponds are washed away if a tornado/water logging/flood in the upazila. About 60-65 ponds are affected by drought.
Health	People of about 5100 families can be affected with various diseases. 5100 families are being affected by draught/water logging/flood/land slide etc. In addition, Water scarcity is found due to lowering of underground water of tube wells during dry monsoon.
Livelihoods	About 10730 farmers, 46530 day labourers lost employment due to flood. In addition, goods of 250 small and large shops are damaged. About 62590 day labourers lost their employment due to tornado. In addition drought takes away employment of 31200 day labourers and 62400 farmers. Besides 3980 fishermen directly or indirectly affected by drought/flood.
Sanitation	There are a total 76831 latrines at Rangunia upazila. 29020 are Pucca and 47801 are Kacha. About 29020 latrines can be affected if a flood occurs. About 9300 latrines can be affected by tornado.
Infrastructure	About 85 KM Kacha road & HBB road 62 km. out of total 404 KM, inundation of 28700 homes out 79189 homes, 16 educational institutions out 228 , 12 Hatbazars out of 38 Hatbazars, 29020 Kacha homes out of 79189 homes and 45 culverts can be affected by floods, land Slide, tornado & water logging.
